- Taxation & Affordability | Leading on advocating for tax policy that protects the purchase of a home and affordability.
- Mortgage Interest Deduction | Continue to protect the mortgage interest deduction to keep Kentuckians in their homes.
- Access to Fair Housing | Advocates for increased access to home ownership including housing affordability.
- Private Property Rights | Private property rights are the cornerstone of Realtors efforts at the local and state levels, constantly monitoring policies that impact the consumers and the real estate industry.
- Smart Growth & Development | Represented the real estate community in the development of Plan 2040, the long range plan for the growth and planning of Louisville Metro.

 a Kentucky real estate licensee engages in when marketing a property for a seller, yet the wholesaler is
 currently not required to hold a license in Kentucky.
